# Flip Your Spring Break Sunny-Side Up

Brrr! In the midst of chilly February, look to the light at the end of the tunnel—spring break is just around the corner! Here are some quick travel tips to keep your info private:

- Avoid public Wi-Fi. Public Wi-Fi is insecure and easy to hack. If you plan to connect in public places like restaurants, airports, and hotels, do so using <u>PittNet</u> <u>VPN (Pulse Secure)</u>. Otherwise, spring for a few extra gigs of data; it'll be worth it.
- Change your passwords. Before you go and when you get back, change your passwords. You can use <u>Pitt Password Manager (LastPass)</u> to generate unique passwords and lock them up.
- 3. **Don't broadcast your whereabouts.** It's tempting to post on your IG and snap stories that you're out of

town, but hold off until you get back to post vaycay pics. This way, you aren't telling people that your house has been left unattended.

- 4. **Download security software.** Pitt IT provides you with free <a href="Antivirus (Symantec Endpoint">Anti-Malware</a> (Malwarebytes) <a href="Protection">Protection</a> that you can use to keep your devices secure.
- 5. **Keep an eye on each other.** When you travel with friends, stick together. If you separate, know where they're going and when they'll be back. The <u>Rave Guardian app</u> (see next article) lets you monitor their location and alert the authorities if needed.
